


Making the 54-40 or Fight Block

Use four Tri Recs units, four orange four patch units, and one 3" square of black to make a 54-40 or Fight block. See figure 8. Repeat to make a total of sixteen blocks.



Making the Four Patch Chain Block

Use five four patch units and four 3" squares of black to make a block. See figure 9. Repeat to make a total of twelve blocks.



The remaining four patch units will be used when making the corner blocks and in the pieced border.

Making the Corner Block

Cut a total of eight 1³/₄" squares from various brights.

Use one 3" x 8" rectangle of black, three 3" squares of black, two four patch units, one 1¾" x 3" rectangle of black, and two of the 1¾" squares of bright that you just cut to make a corner block. See figure 10.

Begin by making the center unit. Sew the two bright squares together. Press the seam allowances to one side. Add the small rectangle to the pair of squares. Follow figure 10 to complete a corner block. Repeat to make a total of four blocks.


