Mystery patterns usually do not give you color suggestions, but since few of you will make this quilt as a mystery, the pattern is written using the colors that were used in my quilt. Feel free to change the colors.

Fabric Requirements

<i>White</i> Yardage includes the border.	4¼ yards
<i>Medium Blue</i> 4 or more different fabrics	1¼ yards total
<i>Dark Blue</i> 4 or more different fabrics	1 yard total
Backing	4 yards
Binding	3/4 yard

Cutting Instructions

You will need a set of Tri Recs tools to make this quilt.

Strips are cut across the width of the fabric making them approximately 40" long with a selvage on each of the short ends.

White

Cut two strips 13" wide.

Use the strips to cut four 13" squares. Cut each square twice, diagonally, into quarter-square triangles. Yield: 16 triangles



From leftovers of the 13" strips, cut two 8" squares.

Cut each square once, diagonally, into half-square triangles. Yield: 4 triangles



Cut seventeen strips 3" wide. Reserve six strips for the border.

Use the remaining eleven strips to cut the following pieces: eighty 3" squares, four 1¾" x 3" rectangles, and sixty-four Tri triangles.

When cutting the Tri triangles, use the unmarked solid line halfway between the $2\frac{1}{2}$ " line and the $3\frac{1}{2}$ " line, not the dashed line that is labeled 3". The tip of the Tri tool will line up with the opposite side of the strip when the correct line is on the edge of the strip.

Cut twenty-one strips 13/4" wide.

Medium Blue

From each of the four fabrics, cut the following pieces:

one 3" strip and two 134" strips.

When you have completed cutting the strips, you will have a total of four 3" strips and eight 13/4" strips.

Reserve the 1³/₄" strips for strip-piecing four patch units.

Use the 3" strips to cut sixty-four Recs triangles and sixty-four reverse Recs triangles. Again, use the unmarked solid line halfway between the $2\frac{1}{2}$ " line and the $3\frac{1}{2}$ " line, not the dashed line that is labeled 3".

Dark Blue

From each of the four fabrics, cut three strips 134'' wide.

In addition, cut a fourth $1\frac{3}{4}$ " strip from your favorite of the four fabrics. When you have completed cutting the strips, you will have a total of thirteen $1\frac{3}{4}$ " strips.

Piecing Instructions

Press the seam allowances in the directions shown by the arrows in each illustration.

Use the Tri triangles of white and the Recs and reverse Recs triangles of medium blue to make sixty-four Tri Recs units. See figure 1.



Use six $1\frac{3}{4}$ " strips of white and six $1\frac{3}{4}$ " strips of dark blue to make six panels like the one shown in figure 2.






fig. 3 crosscut 136 sections 1¾" wide make 68 four patches

Crosscut the panels from figure 2 into $136 \ 134''$ wide sections. Use the sections to make sixty-eight four patch units. See figure 3.

Use eight 1³/₄" strips of white and eight 1³/₄" strips of medium blue to make eight panels like the one shown in figure 4.




Crosscut the panels from figure 4 into $160 \ 1^{3/4}$ " wide sections. Use the sections to make eighty four patch units. See figure 5.




make 80 four patches

Use seven $1\frac{3}{4}$ " strips of white and seven $1\frac{3}{4}$ " strips of dark blue to strip-piece seven panels. See figure 6.



Crosscut the panels from figure 6 into eighty-four 3" wide rail units. See figure 7.



Experiment with all of your units to see what you can make with them. Go on to Step 2 to see how I finished the quilt.
